

## Kickoff for C-Roads Germany – Phase 3

*Successful EU project on the introduction of cooperative intelligent transport systems (C-ITS) continues – further C-ITS services and pilot sites will be put into operation.*

Frankfurt/Main, 25<sup>th</sup> February 2025. Today the project partners of C-Roads Germany are officially launching the new EU project C-Roads Germany – Phase 3 (CRG-3), which will further advance the introduction of cooperative intelligent transportation systems (C-ITS).

With the predecessor projects C-Roads Germany and C-Roads Germany – Urban Nodes, the project team has been testing C-ITS in real traffic environment since 2016 and has made a decisive contribution to transferring the systems and services from pilot to regular operation. In addition to the development, operation and harmonisation of C-ITS services in Lower Saxony, Hesse and the three urban pilots in Dresden, Kassel and Hamburg, the transfer of the developed framework conditions to the C-Roads platform has also achieved significant milestones for the Europe-wide C-ITS rollout.

As part of the next project phase C-Roads Germany – Phase 3, further C-ITS services will be set up over the next three years, and the C-Roads family will be extended further by three urban pilots in Frankfurt am Main, Hanover and Kaiserslautern.
